







FOURTH CLASS B

PTP UPDATE

New Maths resources



RESTORATIVE PRACTICE

The RP mentor programme is a new programme to the school, this programme involves 6th class teaching the values of Restorative Practice in 3rd Class.

With this programme M. Kate taught the 6th class mentors how to deliver the 5 lessons, in these sessions we spoke about the importance of demonstrating leadership skills, anticipating problems, exercising patience and understanding. The mentors grew so much in confidence and by the end of the 5 sessions they were all mini teachers! In these 5 RP lessons delivered to 3rd Class there were various ice breaker games and circle time. The ice breaker games create a classroom where connection and cooperation is valued. The circle time was a good opportunity to introduce a speaking toy where 3rd class understood that we can only share our opinion or ideas when holding the toy. The mentors also led lessons in how to respond when there is conflict, they spoke about the importance of listening and how we should always ask the Restorative questions. The Restorative questions help rebuild a relationship after harm has happened, they aim to diffuse the conflict and give people a chance to explain how they felt at the time. The mentors loved working with 3rd class and they looked forward to these weekly sessions. 3rd Class had a great time and spoke so positively of our mentors too!
